Morgan Drescher Music Scholarship

It is the intention of the Rising Sun Band Boosters to benefit any student who, having been a four year Rising Sun High School band student, chooses to pursue further education in music.

Requirements:

- *Only applications from FOUR YEAR high school band students will be accepted. (Exception: Any transfer student who has completed two years at another school and then completes two years at Rising Sun will also be eligible.)
- *Applications are to be made through the band director in the form of a personal essay outlining the student's educational plans.
- *The applicant shall show that he/she is enrolled in and is attending an accredited school of music.

*No specific class rank or G.P.A. is required.

*All applications must be received by the band director by May 1.

General Information:

*Both majors and minors in general, sound, and instrumental music will be considered for scholarships.

- *The band boosters may award one \$1,000.00 scholarship (for a major), one \$500.00 scholarship (for a minor), and one \$250.00 scholarship (for an endorsement) each calendar year.
- *This scholarship is non-renewable.
- *Funds will be distributed by the band boosters in the form of a personal cash award.

*Scholarships are intended to be used to help offset the costs involved with a student's *music education* (books, instruments, music).

*Submitting an application does not guarantee that a scholarship will be awarded.

Guidelines:

*Students must complete three semesters of music school before they are eligible to receive scholarship money.

*The band booster executive committee will evaluate the applications and determine the dispersal of scholarship money.

Application Evaluation:

The band booster executive committee will consider the following when determining who shall receive scholarships:

*order applications are received in.

*year in college (students with more years of music school who have not yet received scholarship money will take precedence).

*financial need.

Any executive member who has a child applying for a scholarship will not have a vote in determining dispersal of scholarship money.

These guidelines are effective September 1, 1998.
